COLONEL JOHN D. WILLIAMS

Colonel John D. Williams is the Commander, 155th Air Refueling Wing, Lincoln, Nebraska. He is responsible for organizing, training, and equipping four groups and 10 squadrons executing worldwide aerial refueling, cargo, aeromedical evacuation, and humanitarian relief operations. It is his duty to ensure airmen are prepared and ready to deploy in support of domestic and federal missions.

Colonel Williams earned his commission through Air Force Reserve Officer Training Corps at the University of Nebraska – Lincoln before joining the Nebraska Air National Guard. He has held a variety of flying, staff, and command assignments including Headquarters National Guard Bureau acting Director of KC-135 Training, EUCOM J5/8 Bilateral Affairs Officer and EUCOM Deputy Chief of the Office of Defense Cooperation – Prague. In Prague, he facilitated multinational cooperation, Foreign Military Sales, and oversaw the International Military Education and Training program. He served as Operations Group Chief of Standards & Evaluations before being selected for squadron command. As Operations Group Council Chairman, Colonel Williams led 19 Air National Guard Air Refueling Groups through deployment and related training issues enhancing fleet readiness and availability to Combatant Commanders.

He has flown numerous homeland defense and domestic operation missions and deployed in support of operations Joint Guard, Joint Forge, Allied Force, Southern and Northern Watch, Enduring Freedom, Iraqi Freedom, and Freedom's Sentinel.



Colonel Williams is a command pilot with more than 5,000 flight hours, including 560 combat hours in the KC-135. Prior to assuming his current position, the colonel was commander of the 155th Operations Group.
